Job description:

You will contribute to the project *European Labour Law Network "Restatement of Labour Law in Europe"*. The objective of the project is to prepare a comprehensive comparative survey of national laws on "dismissal protection". Labour law experts from all EU Member States as well as from EU candidate countries are participating in the project. The European project partners are the European Trade Union Confederation (ETUC), the Confederation of German Employers' Associations (BDA), the European Association of Labour Court Judges (EALCJ), the European Employment Lawyers Association (EELA) as well as the European Foundation for the Improvement of Living and Working Conditions (EUROFOUND). The project is financed by the European Commission.

You will support the project leader, Professor Dr. Bernd Waas. You will contribute to the preparation of country reports in collaboration with the experts of the national network as well as with the partner organisations, review the reports and edit them for publication.

Requirements:

In addition to a successful completion of the First Law Examination or an equivalent degree, this challenging task requires a special interest in labour law, which should also be reflected in previous training courses. In addition

- knowledge of European and comparative labour law,
- high level of proficiency in English, as well as
- sound knowledge of standard IT applications.

Additional requirements include conceptual skills, flexibility and the ability to work independently as well as within a team; reliability and workplace etiquette rounds out your profile.
